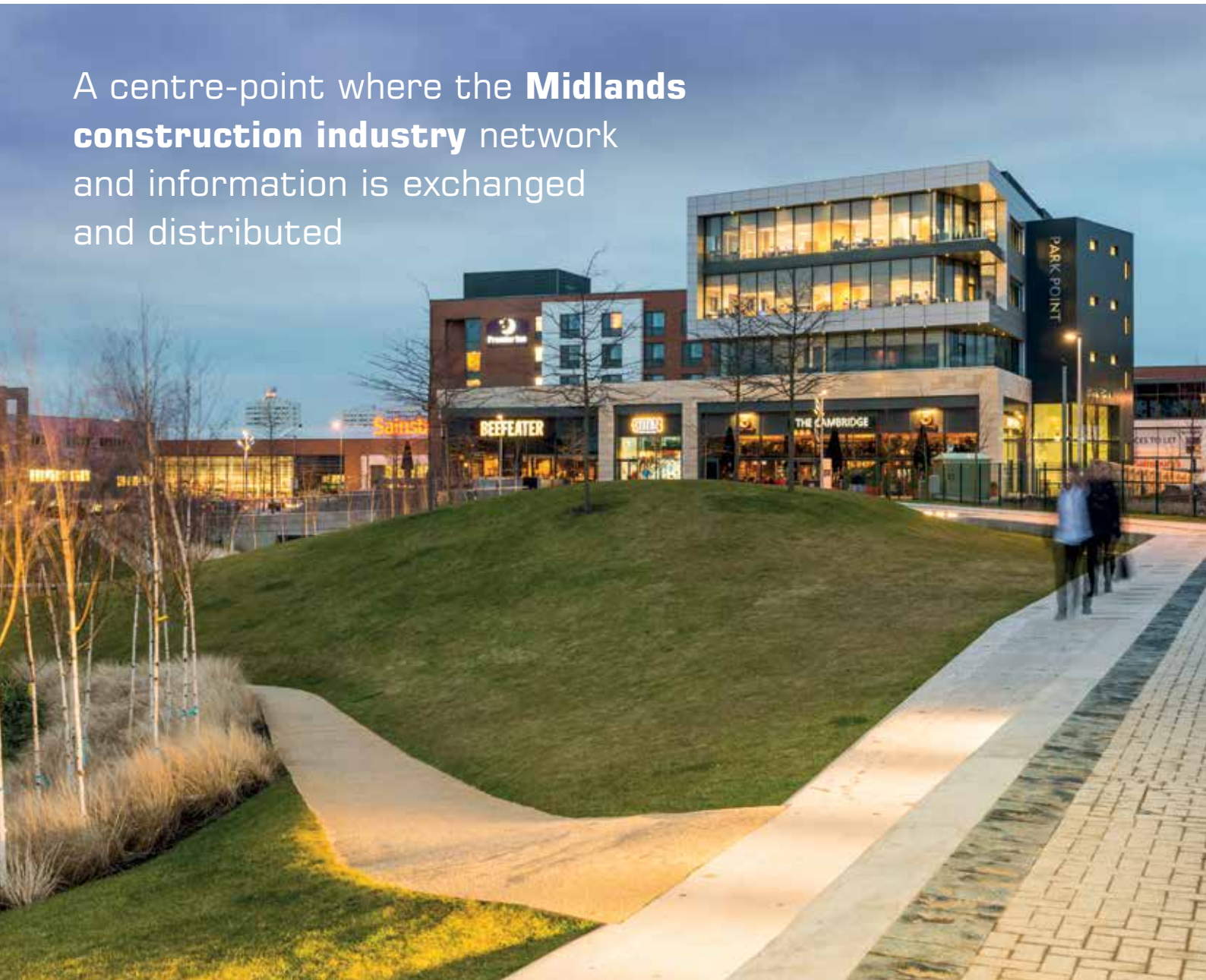

Membership
